The Atalanta Project is a not-for-profit educational enterprise founded in 1994 by members of SUBUD USA. The project is being built on 44 acres of land donated by the Manitou Foundation in Crestone, Colorado. Our intention is to create a place that fosters and demonstrates the ability to live with personal responsibility, in peace and harmony with all creation.

Atalanta is using permaculture land use design to create the setting for demonstrating sustainable living through cultural, economic and environmental programs. Our buildings demonstrate alternative methods and materials, renewable energy sources and ecologically appropriate technology. Our current projects include the Community Co-op Orchard Garden, the High Valley Dairy Goat and Sheep Co-op, a Therapeutic Riding Program and plans for a dormitory on the land.

In addition, we have sponsored workshops in alternative building technologies and permaculture, an Eco-Arts Camp, and cultural events, such as the Volunteer Recognition Day Luncheon, Community Easter Egg Hunt, and the May Day Celebration. This project will benefit the SLV Community, as well as drawing participants regionally, nationally, and globally with opportunities for participation in all programs, including mentorships.

Pilots for Prevention

A Mentoring Program "Helping Youth Travel Through Challenging Times"

Volunteers: Mentors are carefully screened volunteers. They are interviewed, and background checks and reference checks are conducted. They are then matched with a youth of similar interests. Mentors enrich their own lives through the joy of a developing soul. They help a youth build character and self-esteem, and both youth and mentor learn from each other. A mentor makes a strong commitment for a few hours each week and receives a lifetime of gratitude.

Youth: Youth are chosen and referred to the program that have additional risk factors in their lives. A youth at risk of making negative choices includes children being raised by a single parent, latch-key youth with a lot of unsupervised time, youth who have moved numerous times, children in foster care, or children of parents who are too busy, neglectful or drug or alcohol addicted. The youth participate only with the support and permission of their families or guardians.

Activities: The youth and volunteers are invited to a fun and healthy activity every month. Pilots for Prevention offers individual attention and on-going support to participants. Creative drug and alcohol prevention programs are offered in Saguache County Schools. Once a week in each of the three school districts, PFP offers "Homework Club" with snacks, tutoring and educational games provided after school.

I challenge you to consider becoming a mentor. And if you do, don't choose the beautiful child on center stage. It is the youth with the dirty face and the angry glare that needs a friend.

This program is funded through the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division State of Colorado Department of Human Services. It serves youth throughout Saguache County, regardless of income, and is administered by the Center Consolidated School District.
