COMPATIBLE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

SAGUACHE DOWNTOWN REVITALIZATION PROJECT

A collaborative project to revitalize the Town of Saguache, our County seat, starting with 4th Street, the heart of downtown Saguache. ScSEED is coordinating and fundraising in partnership with the Town and twenty-five partners that make up the Saguache Downtown Revitalization Partnership. This includes restarting the Saguache Chamber of Commerce, providing SBDC monthly counseling services and Business Roundtable Forum.

BIOMASS INNOVATION COMPETITION

ScSEED will inventory agricultural by-products and biomass throughout the SLV. Then design an entrepreneurial competition for an innovative business concept that uses the biomass in a commercial capacity.

LOCAL CURRENCY PROJECT

A partnership with the Saguache County Credit Union (SCCU), with steps in planning for an educational effort and launch of a recirculating county wide currency.

SCCU IDA PROGRAM

With ScSEED as the Fiscal Sponsor, the IDA program is a matching savings plan developed to assist residents in building assets, such as home-ownership, education, and business start-up or expansion. This enables many low-income Saguache County families and individuals to save towards their goals, and provides the added benefit of financial education.

AGRICULTURE & ENVIRONMENT CONSERVATION

RECYCLING INITIATIVE

A volunteer driven program to reinvest and renew the critical importance of recycling in Saguache County. Waste reduction, environmental protection, job creation, cost of living reduction measures and youth engagement are the main motivations driving this initiative. Saguache County's strong community support provides an excellent foundation for establishing the program.

KERBER CREEK RESTORATION

A joint partnership of the BLM, the Natural Resources Conservation Service, Trout Unlimited, local landowners, and others. The project involves tailings removal, in situ treatment, re-vegetation, installation of fish habitat structures, stream bank stabilization, and fencing to keep cattle from the rehabilitated areas. The major goals include increased forage area for cattle and wildlife, healthy stream morphology and biota, and removing Kerber Creek from that state's 303 (d) list of impaired waterways.

WATER QUALITY

ScSEED is assisting the SLV Ecosystem Council with water and air quality based programs throughout the San Luis Valley. Providing free water testing and education on a first come first served basis. ScSEED is also included in the CARE (Community Action for a Renewed Environment) program, supporting community-based collaborative partnerships to develop a comprehensive understanding of toxic risks and setting community risk priorities regarding any environmental media – air, water, land, and/or in the indoor environment.

EDUCATION & ENRICHMENT

RANCHING WAY OF LIFE VIDEO PROJECT

A documentary series for youth education, general audiences and historical archives of the family ranch way of life, folk arts and historical heritage of the San Luis Valley ranchlands. Phase 4 of the project includes DVD distribution to the general public and to classrooms in schools throughout the SLV.

LIBRARY

ScSEED is assisting with expansion of Public Library services with fundraising and development support.

RANCHING CELEBRATION

In January 2009, ScSEED hosted this 9th annual community event to celebrate the ranching culture; featuring music, stories and poems of the ranching way of life in the northern San Luis Valley.
